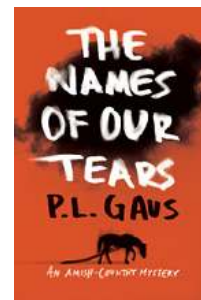
Author Paul L.Gaus presents "My Amish-Country Mysteries & the Interesting Amish People of Holmes County"
